ANZAC Day 2011

From reports received it would appear as though Sub Branches and local communities are well on the way to presenting Commemorative Services to mark the 96th Anniversary of ANZAC Day. Through community support and the generosity of *Lotterywest* we are able to present dignified services throughout Western Australia to mark this very special anniversary. With ANZAC Day falling within the Easter break this year we do not anticipate any reduction in attendance at Commemorative Services for veterans and members of the public to recognise the sacrifices made by our Service Men and Women. It's that one day in the year when all Australians remember those who serve and have served their country.

In Perth, the Dawn Service will be conducted under the same arrangements as previous years with Rover Scouts maintaining the night vigil leading into the traditional Dawn Service. We anticipate a public attendance of around 45, 000 and logistical arrangements are well in hand to accommodate that number. Full details of public transport and ceremonial arrangements will be published in *The West Australian* newspaper on Thursday 21 April.

Following the Dawn Service there will be a Gunfire Breakfast in Stirling Gardens to which the general public are invited.

The 2011 ANZAC Day March will follow a different route this year due to road changes in the Perth CBD. Full details relating to Form Up locations and other arrangements are still being finalised and will be released in newspapers and on RSL Website at a later date.

Centenary of ANZAC

The announcement by government of funding allocation to WA submissions for the commemoration of the Centenary of ANZAC was recently announced. The endorsement of the Albany initiative should ensure the centenary commemorative activities continue to get community support. We are hopeful that WA will receive additional financial support from other funding sources to present activities that will acknowledge the contribution that was, and still is being made, to the defence of our country by our defence force personnel.

The Albany Project was recently reported in 'The West Australian' by Malcolm Quekett and he wrote:

"A re-enactment of the departure from Albany of ships carrying soldiers to World War 1 and an interpretive centre could play a major role in the commemoration of the ANZAC centenary. The projects have been endorsed in a report to the Federal Government by the National Commission on the commemoration of the ANZAC Centenary...

The report said Albany had a rich ANZAC heritage and in 1914 had been the gathering point for ships carrying forces that became known as the ANZACs

It recommended a commemorative event be held at Albany and broadcast nationally, which could include assembling ships in King George Sound on November 1, 2014 to represent the first convoy. Ships from allied countries that were former enemies could also be invited.

The commission also recommended the development of an interpretative centre on Mount Adelaide in Albany with panoramic views of King George Sound."

The planning committee is to be congratulated on a successful outcome to their well prepared and presented submission to government.



New Constitution

A writing team has commenced revising the State Constitution and expects to circulate the Revised Constitution (first draft) to Sub Branches within the next two weeks. Our Legal Advisors believe the rewrite is necessary as we progress our application to have RSL classified as an Association at a higher Taxation Status than that which currently exists.

If our proposed structure is accepted by members and endorsed by Corporate Affairs there will be significant benefits to members and Sub Branches. Consideration of the new governance model is a move RSL must consider. The rewrite will ensure a more equitable and inclusive structure for decision making within the organisation. In the meantime, members and Sub Branches are assured that the current Rules and By Laws are the ones under which we will operate. There will be no change until the membership has had an opportunity to debate and vote on the proposals at a forthcoming Special General Meeting.

New Online Health Assistance

Two new websites are being piloted to provide the ex-service community with access to vital health resources, the Minister for Veterans' Affairs and Minister for Defence Science and Personnel, Warren Snowdon, announced today.

Mr Snowdon said the sites, the *Wellbeing Toolbox* and *touchbase*, have been developed specifically for ex-service and transitioning personnel, their families and friends to help them face challenges that moving from military to civilian life may present.

The *Wellbeing Toolbox* provides interactive educational material in key areas such as problem solving, building support, helpful thinking, getting active, keeping calm and sleeping better and has been developed in conjunction with leading experts at the Australian Centre for Posttraumatic Mental Health

The *touchbase* website, developed jointly by Defence and the Department of Veterans' Affairs provides information on lifestyle issues such as employment and finances, and is a one-stop-shop for useful links on topics ranging from compensation and finances to health, housing and parenting support.

Australian War Veterans are entitled to have an Australian National Flag for use at their funerals. Upon completion of the Service, the flag is then presented to the surviving spouse or family members on behalf of a grateful national.

Flags are available from a Federal Member of Parliament, or Flagworld.

Japanese War Records

The Australian Government welcomes Japanese Foreign Minister Maehara's apology to Australian Prisoners of War (POWs) for the horrors they endured under Japanese control in World War II.

Foreign Minister Maehara's apology was made in a spirit of reconciliation during the visit to Japan of five former Australian POWs and their carers under the auspices of the Japan-POW Friendship Group.

Foreign Minister Maehara also announced Japan would return to Australia historical records of former Australian POWs held by Japan during World War II.

Minister Snowdon said the Japanese records may shed light on the fate of the members of Lark Force, many of whom were lost when the Japanese transport *Montevideo Maru* was sunk by a US submarine in 1942.

"The Government recognises that there are families who remain uncertain about the fate of those captured by the Japanese during World War II," said Mr Snowdon.

The records are expected to be housed in the Australian War Memorial.

Rehabilitation for Wounded Soldiers

The Minister for Veterans' Affairs and the Minister for Defence Science and Personnel, Warren Snowdon, visited the United States of America earlier in March to examine the best practice medical research and techniques in rehabilitation and support for Australia's wounded soldiers.

"The Australian Government is committed to providing the best support available to our wounded troops and, through innovative research and continued collaboration with other countries, we will go a long way in achieving this," Mr Snowdon said.

Mr Snowdon said the Defense Advanced Research Project Agency has a prosthetics program that aims to build a realistic prosthetic arm-hand combination that allows the wearer to control it naturally by using the brain.

"This will restore a level of independence to amputees and patients with spinal cord injuries. I believe we owe it to our injured personnel to investigate all options for rehabilitation and such advanced technology would contribute significantly to their recovery," Mr Snowdon said.

To look at continuing Australian research, Mr Snowdon will meet with the Deputy Secretary of Defense for Military Personnel Policy, Ms Virginia Penrod, on the Support to Wounded, Injured or Ill (SWIIP).

This project is a joint effort between the Australian departments of Veterans' Affairs and Defence, and is developing a whole-of-life framework for the care of the wounded, injured or ill Australian Defence Force Members.

It will enhance support for members with complex or serious medical conditions transitioning to civilian life, improve information sharing between DVA and Defence relating to injury or illness, with plans to streamline and simplify compensation claims handling; and simplify processes involved in applying for, and acceptance of liability for compensation," Mr Snowdon said.

"I want to ensure that any lessons learnt from the US experience can be used to strengthen our programs for ADF personnel who are wounded, injured or ill," he said.

Funding Boost for the Australian War Memorial

Prime Minister Julia Gillard reaffirmed earlier this month the Government's ongoing commitment to the Australian War Memorial, announcing an additional \$8m per year to support its ongoing operations.

The increased financial support is the result of a comprehensive review ordered by the Prime Minister on funding arrangements for the Australian War Memorial.

The new funding will increase the Memorial's operational budget by \$8 million per year - on top of the Memorial's regular annual funding which is currently \$38 million.

The Prime Minister and the Minister for Veterans' Affairs, Warren Snowdon, visited the Memorial and praised its outstanding contribution to Australian society.

The Prime Minister also announced that Minister Snowdon will take on a new role as Minister Assisting the Prime Minister on the Centenary of ANZAC.

Progress on New Health Program for Veterans

Significant progress is being made towards introducing a new program to improve the health of chronically ill veterans and war widows who have complex care needs and are at risk of hospitalisation.

The Minister for Veterans' Affairs, Warren Snowdon, said service partners had been selected for the innovative Coordinated Veterans' Care (CVC) Program, which starts on 1 May.

Bupa Health Dialog has been selected as the Primary Service Provider. Bupa Health Dialog, the Australian arm of Health Dialog, is a wellness, prevention and chronic disease management company with expertise in analytics. It will analyse client data to identify and contact the veterans and war widows who are DVA Gold Card holders and are most likely to benefit from taking part in the CVC Program.

National Pneumococcal Immunisation

The *National Pneumococcal Immunisation Program for Older Adults* commenced in 2005 and extended into 2006 with 800,000 people aged 65 years or older receiving the free vaccine. To complete the vaccination course a second dose is required 5 years after the first dose. In 2011, there are still 300,000 people aged 70 or over who have not yet had the second dose of pneumococcal pneumonia vaccine, so therefore have not completed the vaccine course.
